811: CALL BEFORE YOU DIG

Remember to always call Iowa One Call as you are plotting out your tree planting, landscaping, or even a new deck, fence, or play area. Before engaging in any type of digging or excavating, it is required by law to contact Iowa One Call at [1-800-292-8989](tel:1-800-292-8989) or **811** at least 48 hours in advance (excluding weekends and legal holidays). Utility locate requests are sent to all involved utilities, such as South Slope, who mark the underground utility locations with flags and paint markings. Please visit iowaonecall.com for more information.



Each utility type is represented by a different color flag (see list below). This procedure is important so you know which areas to avoid when digging. This process eliminates the risk of service disruptions and personal injury as well as considerable fines and penalties.

COOKING CORNER

Meat Quiche

Ingredients

6 eggs	1 frozen deep dish pie shell
2 Tablespoons sour cream	1 8 oz. bag of shredded mexican cheese blend
1/4 cup milk	1/2 cup diced ham
1/4 teaspoon garlic powder	1/2 cup cooked and crumbled bacon
1/4 teaspoon salt/pepper	1 cup cooked and crumbled sausage
1/4 teaspoon parsley	1/2 cup diced onion

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a mixing bowl, whisk together the eggs, sour cream, milk, garlic powder, salt, pepper and parsley. Layer cheese, meat and onions in several layers in pie shell. Pour egg mixture over the top. Place pie tin on middle shelf in oven with a cookie sheet on the lower shelf in case of runover. Bake for one hour or until set. Tips: Consider doubling this recipe since pie shells come two to a package. It's also easy to bake the night before, cool overnight in the fridge and warm in microwave or oven the next morning. Enjoy!

NATIONAL DO-NOT-CALL REGISTRY NOTICE

The National Do-Not-Call Registry, established by the Federal Trade Commission, allows telephone subscribers to avoid solicitations from telemarketers. The registry applies to all telemarketers, with the exception of businesses with whom you have an existing relationship and certain non-profit and political organizations. Commercial telemarketers are not allowed to call you if your number is listed on the National Do-Not-Call Registry.

You may register your residential and wireless telephone numbers for free on the National Do-Not-Call Registry online at donotcall.gov or by telephone at [1-888-382-1222](tel:1-888-382-1222). For TTY call [1-866-290-4236](tel:1-866-290-4236). You must call from the phone number you wish to register. Registrations become effective after 31 days and will remain on the National Do-Not-Call Registry permanently. You can delete your telephone number from the registry by calling [1-888-382-1222](tel:1-888-382-1222) from the telephone number you wish to delete. After you contact the registry to delete your number, it will be removed from the National Do-Not-Call Registry by the next day.
