THE BASICS OF STREAMING TV

Interested in streaming but not sure how to get started? We're here to help!

What is streaming?

Streaming TV is delivered over the internet rather than through traditional cable or satellite TV service.

What do I need?

1. Reliable internet service.
2. A streaming device such as Amazon Fire TV, Apple TV, Roku or a smart TV, which already has streaming apps loaded.
3. A streaming service such as Netflix, Hulu, HBO Max or YouTube TV.

What channels or TV shows are included with a streaming service?

To find a streaming service with the channels you want, go online to **mybundle.tv**. Once there, go to **Find My Bundle** for a streaming service recommendation based on your favorite channels. You can also visit websites of streaming providers such as YouTube TV or Hulu Live to browse their channel lineups.

How do I get connected?

Your streaming device connects to the internet through either an ethernet cable or Wi-Fi and it connects to your television through the HDMI port (unless you have a Smart TV which is preloaded with streaming apps). Once you decide on which services you want (i.e. Hulu Live and Netflix), you'll then subscribe to those services either through the apps on your TV or on their websites.

Now you're ready to stream so grab the popcorn, sit back and enjoy!

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG

Before engaging in any type of digging or excavating such as building a new deck or landscaping, it is required by law to contact Iowa One Call at 1-800-292-8989 or **811** at least 48 hours in advance.

This procedure is important so you know which areas to avoid when digging. It eliminates the risk of service disruptions and personal

injury as well as considerable fines and penalties. Utility locate requests are sent to all involved utilities, such as South Slope, to mark the underground utility locations with flags and paint markings. Please visit iowaonecall.com for more information.

Each utility type is represented by a different colored flag.

	Pink: Temporary markings
	Blue: Water
	Yellow: Gas
	Orange: Communications
	Green: Sewers
	Purple: Reclaimed water
	White: Proposed excavation



COOKING CORNER

Creamy Tortellini

Ingredients

- 9 oz cheese tortellini
- 1/2 yellow onion, thinly sliced
- 3/4 cup frozen peas
- 1 cup chopped asparagus
- 2 large garlic cloves, minced
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 1/2 cup shaved parmesan
- 6 slices cooked bacon, chopped
- 3 Tbsp of oil for cooking

Directions

1. Cook tortellini according to the package instructions. Drain and set aside.
2. Preheat a cooking pan over medium heat and add oil.
3. Add onions and cook until softened.
4. Add asparagus and cook until slightly softened. Add peas and garlic, and cook until fragrant.
5. Stir in the heavy cream, parmesan and bacon.
6. Add tortellini and stir until completely mixed.
7. Add salt and pepper to taste. Enjoy!

NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

The National Do-Not-Call Registry, established by the Federal Trade Commission, allows telephone subscribers to avoid solicitations from telemarketers. The registry applies to all telemarketers, with the exception of businesses with whom you have an existing relationship, certain non-profit and political organizations. Commercial telemarketers aren't allowed to call you if your number is listed on the National Do-Not-Call Registry.

You may register your residential and wireless telephone numbers for free on the National Do-Not-Call Registry online at donotcall.gov or by telephone at **1-888-382-1222**. For TTY call **1-866-290-4236**. You must call from the phone number you wish to register. Registrations become effective after 31 days and will remain on the National Do-Not-Call Registry permanently. You can remove your telephone number from the registry by calling **1-888-382-1222** from the telephone number you wish to remove. After you contact the registry to delete your number, it will be removed from the National Do-Not-Call Registry by the next day.

Visit donotcall.gov to submit a complaint, register, verify registration, or to learn more. The Federal Communications Commission requires that this notice is provided to our customers on an annual basis.
